

## Full paper for WBSSTC, 2017

### General guidelines for manuscript preparation

- a. Manuscripts should be submitted in Word (2007 and above) within 4000 to 5000 words.
- b. Font type: Times New Roman,  
Font size:  
Title: 14pt  
Body Text: 12 pts,  
Section heading: 12pt bold,  
Section subheading: 12 pt italics.
- c. Use no more than 4 step sub-sections e.g. 1.2.3.4
- d. Use italics for emphasis
- e. Use the automatic page numbering function to number the pages.
- f. Do not use field functions.
- g. Use tab stops or other commands for indents, not the space bar.
- h. Use the table function, not spreadsheets, to make tables.
- i. Use the equation editor in MS Office for equations and symbols.
- j. Please use internationally accepted signs and symbols for units (SI units), Genus and species names should be in italics.
- k. Generic names of drugs and pesticides are preferred; if trade names are used, the generic name should be given at first mention.
- l. Please use the standard mathematical notation for formulae, symbols, etc.
- m. Italic for single letters that denote mathematical constants, variables, and unknown quantities.
- n. Roman/upright for numerals, operators, and punctuation, and commonly defined functions or abbreviations, e.g., cos, det, e or exp, lim, log, max, min, sin, tan, d (for derivative).
- o. Bold for vectors, tensors, and matrices.

#### A. Title Page

The title page should include:

The name(s) of the author(s)

Title of the paper as appeared in the abstract submitted for the Regional Science Congress

The affiliation(s) and address(es) of the author(s)

The e-mail address, telephone and fax numbers of the corresponding author

## **B. Abstract**

Please provide an abstract of 200 words (the same abstract as submitted for the Regional Science Congress)

## **C. Keywords**

Please provide 4 to 6 keywords which can be used for indexing purposes.

## **D. Image**

- a. Image resolution: minimum 300 dpi, maximum - 600 dpi.
- b. All lines in line drawings should be at least 0.1 mm (0.3 pt) wide. Scanned line drawings and line drawings in bitmap format should have a minimum resolution of 1200 dpi.
- c. Photographs, drawings, or paintings with fine shading, etc. If any magnification is used in the photographs, indicate this by using scale bars within the figures themselves.
- d. Halftones should have a minimum resolution of 300 dpi.
- e. Figures can be sent within the word file. However, for further processing you might be requested to send figures separately and will be intimated in due time if such situation arises.
- f. When preparing your figures, size figures to fit in the column width. For most journals the figures should be 39 mm, 84 mm, 129 mm, or 174 mm wide and not higher than 234 mm.

## **E. References**

*Reference style*

**i. Text:** All citations in the text should refer to:

- a. Single author: the author's name (without initials, unless there is ambiguity) and the year of publication;
- b. Two authors: both authors' names and the year of publication;
- c. Three or more authors: first author's name followed by 'et al.' and the year of publication.
- d. Citations may be made directly (or parenthetically). Groups of references should be listed first alphabetically, then chronologically.

Examples: 'as demonstrated (Allan, 2000a, 2000b, 1999; Allan and Jones, 1999). Kramer et al. (2010) have recently shown ....'

**ii. List:** References should be arranged first alphabetically and then further sorted chronologically if necessary. More than one reference from the same author(s) in the same year must be identified by the letters 'a', 'b', 'c', etc., placed after the year of publication.

- c. Reference to a book:  
Strunk Jr., W., White, E.B., 2000. *The Elements of Style*, fourth ed. Longman, New York.
- d. Reference to a chapter in an edited book:  
Mettam, G.R., Adams, L.B., 2009. How to prepare an electronic version of your article, in: Jones, B.S., Smith, R.Z. (Eds.), *Introduction to the Electronic Age*. E-Publishing Inc., New York, pp. 281–304.
- e. Reference to a website:  
Cancer Research UK, 1975. *Cancer statistics reports for the UK*. <http://www.cancerresearchuk.org/aboutcancer/statistics/cancerstatsreport/> (accessed 13.03.16).
- f. Reference to a dataset:
